Dear Parishioners, this past week we had received a letter signed by all the Bishops of the State of MN stating that Mass will be made public again come Tuesday, May 26. Feel free to read the letter provided in the bulletin, the mailing you will receive next week, or on our website. A reminder that even though Mass will become public again, no one is obligated to come and fulfill their Sunday or Holy Day of obligation at this time.

Mass may look and feel a little different, but hopefully it feels welcome and enjoyable. Here at St. Mary's, we will be unlocking the east-front-handicap-accessible-door of the Church for entrance & departure; the other doors will be locked for now to help maintain flow & cleanliness. Pews will be roped or taped off to try to maintain proper distancing. You can look to our diagram of the Church as well for reference & clarification. Please try to maintain proper distance whether in the pew or communion line; a family or married couple can sit alongside one another – they don't have to be spaced six feet apart. If more seating capacity is needed, look to an usher to help direct you to another location to sit.

We'll be asking parishioners that do come to Church to take a piece of paper handed out to them at the entryway and leave it where they were seated so that the pews can be cleaned in those locations. Hymnals will not be available for a while as well as the congregation will be asked not to sing likewise to help maintain any possible spread through singing; instrumental music and cantors may be assisting to help fill this void. Hand sanitizer will be provided at Church entryways for use as well.

Our plan was to begin with having Mass at 8:30 am only on Sundays to begin with to see how everything goes, which could be either attended or watched livestream on YouTube here in Chokio. In order to watch Mass live, go to "youtube.com" and once there, type in YouTube's search engine: Father John Paul – Mass, & the date the Mass is occurring. For example: Father John Paul - Mass, May 31, 2020 for Sunday's 8:30 am Mass. If one is unable to watch Mass live in our cluster at a certain time and still wishes to watch it later, simply do the steps done as would be for viewing it live: go to "youtube.com" and type the following Mass information as the examples listed up above in YouTube's search engine or go to our Facebook site (St. Mary's Annual Bazaar) as we have been doing otherwise during the pandemic.

Hopefully this all makes sense. Feel free to call the office with questions. This is a unique situation that we find ourselves in, so let us try to respect the decision that each person makes for oneself in this challenging time. If there is a better approach or a better way of handling our current situation, please give me a call. I am all ears to any feedback. God bless, jp
